Trail System on HOA Common Property

At the last HOA board meeting, the Mountain Green Trails Association discussed with the board the desire to team up with the HOA to create trails on common property to be used by hikers and mountain bikers. The main area that was discussed for improved trails was the 20+ acres of common area on the north end of the HOA adjacent to the water tower. The board also discussed cleaning up that area and installing a small pavilion/pergola and picnic table. This is an area that is off limits to motorized vehicles. The common area by the waterfall was also identified as an area that might have improved trails. If the board pursues these improvements, they would be looking for homeowners with connections to equipment to help create the trails.

The board will be meeting again with them on December 6th at 7 PM at the Cottonwoods Water Building to look at maps, potential trails and improvements. All interested homeowners are invited to attend this meeting to learn more.

Off Road Vehicles

Projects Requiring Authorization by the Architectural Review Committee

HOA covenants state that, "No major improvements, including without limitation, the construction of any residence, garage, outbuilding, or other permanent structure may be constructed, erected, or installed on any lot without the approval of the Architectural Review Committee". HOA covenants state that, 'No fences, wall hedges or non-living screens shall be constructed on any lot without approval from the Architectural Review Committee.
